2018 CALA SEMINAR SPEAKERS

Carmen Sessions Scott, Esq. – Member, Motley Rice LLC

Carmen graduated from the College of Charleston and the University of South Carolina, School of Law. She is a frequent speaker on medical litigation and topics involving women's products. She has been a key litigator in the In Re: Fosamax, In Re: Yasmin, In Re: NuvaRing and the In Re: Essure cases. She has served on the Plaintiff's Steering Committee for the Mirena Product Liability state court consolidation in New Jersey and the In Re Talcum Powder litigation, among others.

Jeff Harris, Esq. – Catawba Indian Nation

Jeff Harris is the Tribal Governance Attorney for the Catawba Indian Nation, the only federally-recognized tribe in South Carolina. He is also a citizen of the Catawba Nation. His work focuses on reforming the Catawba Constitution, researching and drafting ordinances and codes for the Nation, the creation and expansion of a tribal justice system including tribal courts, and advising departments of the tribal government. He holds a Bachelor's degree in Political Science from Brigham Young University and a Juris Doctor from Duke University School of Law.

Naomi Nation, Certified Legal Assistant, South Carolina Certified Paralegal

Naomi received an Associate Degree in Legal Secretary Studies from Jefferson State Junior College, Birmingham, Alabama. She and her family moved to Charleston, in August 1985 and Naomi became the legal secretary to Attorney Thomas P. Morrison where she remained for ten years. In 1997 she became the Executive Secretary to former Solicitor David P. Schwacke and has worked as the Executive Secretary for the Ninth Circuit Solicitor's Office since that time. Naomi is currently supporting her third solicitor, The Honorable Scarlett Wilson, who became the first female solicitor in 2007.

Richard Krenmayer attended the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth with David Stasaitis where they both received a B.S. in Business Information Systems and started Stasmayer, Inc.
